

4 Nōku te ao The world is mine

Session plan

Key messages

- Information helps me make good decisions about my career.
- I can find out more about my career choices by asking questions.

Session sequence

1. Download and display the Scholarship event posters for Te Matatini, Waka Ama Nationals and Ngā Manu Kōrero Nationals in different places around the room.
2. Tell rangatahi they have been awarded a scholarship to attend one of the three events because of the dedication and potential they have shown. Ask them to stand by the scholarship event poster they would like to accept, Te Matatini, Waka Ama Nationals or Ngā Manu Kōrero Nationals.
3. Tell rangatahi you will give them more information about the three events. Because of this information they may change their mind about which scholarship to accept and move to a different event poster.
4. Use the six pieces of scholarship event information in the kaiārahi resource. Give rangatahi one piece of information at a time for the three events. They can move to another event poster anytime they want to.
5. Once rangatahi have all six pieces of information ask them to return to their seats and discuss the following questions.
 - How many of you changed your mind about your scholarship event?
 - What kind of information made you change your mind?
 - What does this activity highlight about the importance of information when making decisions?
 - How might choosing a scholarship event be similar to career decision making?
 - What kind of information would you want to know when making career decisions?
 - Where can you find career information to help you?

Accommodation	Backpackers	Apartment two blocks from event	Five-star hotel near event

Includes	Free pass to a local museum	Free airline ticket	Free ticket to a concert and backstage pass to meet the stars
