Future Finder

If you're looking for career inspiration, the Tahatū Future Finder can help get you started. It takes just a few minutes to fold and might give you some career ideas. Play it on your own or with whānau and friends.

Then check out **tahatu.govt.nz** and try the Interest quiz to find your top interests, values and skills. You can record some of them right here on your Future Finder for reference.

Tahatū has more than 800 career ideas, over 200 job profile videos, a range of advice pages and much more to start building a plan for a career you're proud of.

How to play:

1. Holding the Future Finder on your fingertips, the player chooses one of the four directions.
2. Spell the chosen direction out loud, opening and closing the Future Finder with your fingers in time to each letter (N-O-R-T-H means opening and closing five times). Alternate the direction it is opened, from forwards, to sideways.
3. The player reads the four options of 'what they like' inside the Future Finder. They then say the number of the one they like best.
4. Repeat the opening and closing action, this time spelling out the number they chose.
5. The player now chooses one of the options shown and opens the Future Finder to reveal a list of career ideas.
6. Try the Interest quiz at **tahatu.govt.nz** for more career ideas then record your results in the centre of your Future Finder.

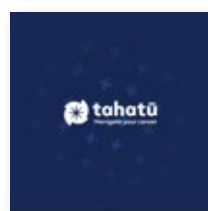

Instructions:

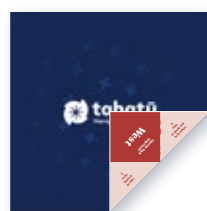
Carefully assemble the Future Finder as shown (this takes about five minutes).
You will need a pair of scissors.



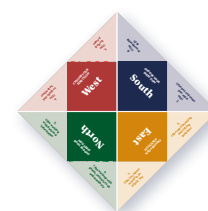
1. Cut along the dotted line.



2. You are left with a square of paper. Start with the blue side up.



3. Fold a corner to the centre.



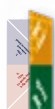
4. Fold all corners to the centre.



5. Turn over. Fold a corner to the centre.



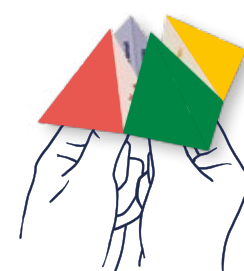
6. Fold all corners to the centre.



7. Fold in half to crease.



8. Open back up and fold in half to crease the other way.



9. Hold from beneath to play.
